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1. IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

2. SET UP THE TELEPHONE

2.1 Package Contents

The package contains the following items:

- Base station
- Corded handset
- AC power adapter
- Telephone line cord
- User's manual

2.2 Location

For maximum coverage and reduce the interference, here are some guidelines you should consider when you place the base unit,

- place it away from electronic appliances such as televisions, microwave ovens, radios, personal computers, wireless devices or other cordless phones.
- avoid facing radio frequency transmitters, such as external antennas of mobile phone cell stations.
- avoid plugging it into the same circuit as other major household electrical appliances because of the potential for interference. Try moving the appliance or the base unit to another power outlet.

If the reception for a base unit location is not satisfactory, move it to another location for better reception.

2.3 Connect the Corded Base Station

Plug one end of the telephone line cord into a telephone jack or a DSL filter.

If you have DSL highspeed Internet service, a DSL filter (not included) is required.

Route the telephone line cord through this slot.

Click the wall mount bracket securely into the mounting slots for tabletop use.

Plug the other end of the telephone line cord into the telephone jack on the back of the telephone base.

NOTE

- Use only the power adapter supplied with the base station.
- Classified TNV-3 according to EN62368-1 standard.
- Classified "hazardous voltage" according to EN62368-1 standard


2.4 First use of your base

After you have connected the power adaptor, the display asks you to select your text language with the keys \forall / \blacktriangle , press **MENU/OK** to valid.

Then enter the date with the keypad and validate by pressing MENU/OK .

Then enter the correct hour with the keypad and validate by pressing .

Then select your talking language with the keys ▼/▲, press MENU/OK to valid



Plug the large end of the telephone base power adapter into a power outlet.

Route the power adapter cord through this slot.

Plug the small end of the telephone base power adapter into the power adapter jack on the back of the telephone base.


Plug the corded handset cord into the corded handset jack on the back of the telephone base.

2.5 Base Station Installation options

Your telephone base is ready for tabletop use. If you want to mount your telephone on a wall, follow the steps to connect the telephone base with a standard dual-stud telephone wall mounting plate. You may need a professional to install the mounting plate.

25.1 Tabletop to Wall Mount Installation


- 1. Unplug the power adapter from the power outlet. Unplug the telephone line cord from the wall jack (or DSL filter).
- 2. Put the corded handset aside. Hold down the switch hook on the telephone base, and then slide the handset tab upwards to remove it from the slot. Rotate the handset tab by 180 degrees. Then, replace the handset tab into the slot until it locks into position.
- 3. Press down on the tabs of the wall mount bracket to release it from tabletop orientation.
- 4. Rotate the wall mount bracket down and push it into the telephone base until it clicks into place.
- 5. Plug the telephone line cord (or DSL filter) into the wall jack. Plug the power adapter into a power outlet. Align the slots on the back of the telephone base with the studs of the wall mounting plate.
- 6. Slide the telephone base down until it locks securely. Bundle the telephone line cord and power adapter cord neatly with twist ties.



2.5.2 Wall Mount to Tabletop Installation

- 1. Unplug the power adapter from the power outlet. Unplug the telephone line cord from the wall jack (or DSL filter). If the telephone line cord and power adapter cord are bundled, untie them first. Push the telephone base up to remove it from wall.
- 2. Put the corded handset aside. Hold down the switch hook on the telephone base, and then slide the handset tab upwards to remove it from the slot. Rotate the handset tab by 180 degrees. Then, replace the handset tab into the slot until it locks into position.
- 3. Gently pull upward to release the wall mount bracket. Rotate the wall mount bracket up to tabletop position and push it into the telephone base until it clicks into place.
- Plug the telephone line cord (or DSL filter) into the wall jack. Plug the power adapter into an power outlet. Bundle the telephone line cord and power adapter cord neatly with twist ties if necessary.



3.3 Base LCD Display

The screen display gives you information on the current status of the telephone.



*	This will display when there is a new calls list entry or if one is being viewed.

3.4 Text and Digit Entry Table

The following tables show you where each letter and punctuation character can be found. This will be helpful when storing a name in the phonebook or renaming your handset.

In editing mode, a cursor is displayed to indicate the current text entry position. It is positioned at the right of the last character entered.

Writing Tips:

- 1. Once a character is selected, the cursor will move to the next position after a short pause.
- 2. You can move the cursor within the text by $\blacktriangle \nabla$ to amend the text entry.
- 3. Press $Int/\bigotimes/C$ on the telephone base, to delete the last character.
- 4. Press and hold *Int*/X /C on the telephone base, to delete the entire text string.

4. USE YOUR PHONE

4.1 Make an External Call

4.1.1 Preparatory Dialing

Enter the phone number and lift the corded handset or press **SPEAKER** \triangleleft to dial the number. Press **Int**/ \bigotimes /**C** to clear the entry when entering the number.

4.1.2 Direct Dialing

Lift the corded handset or press **SPEAKER I**) to take the line and enter the phone number.

4.1.3 Call from the Phonebook

Press PHONEBOOK to access the phonebook and press **A v**to select the desired phonebook entry. Lift the corded handset or press **SPEAKER ()** to dial out to the selected phonebook entry.

4.1.4 Call from the Call List

Press **A** CALLS to access the call list and press ▲/▼ to select the desired call list entry. Lift the corded handset or press **SPEAKER** ■) to dial out to the selected call list entry.

4.1.5 Call from the Redial List

- 1. Press 👎 to access the redial list
- 2. Press $\blacktriangle \mathbb{N}$ to select the desired redial number.
- 3. Lift the corded handset or press **SPEAKER ()** to dial out to the selected redial number.

4.1.6 Call Timer

Your handset or base automatically times the duration of each call. The call timer will display a few seconds after the call has ended. It is shown in hours, minutes and seconds format (HH:MM: SS)

4.2 Make a Call from Direct Access Memory

In idle mode, press any direct memory key in which a number is stored, the phone will automatically dial out the telephone number stored in the selected memory key in speakerphone mode.

OR

Lift the corded handset or press **SPEAKER** (), and then press any direct memory key in which a number is stored to dial the number pre-stored into the keys respectively.

NOTES:

- You need to set the direct access number first. See **Section 7.1** for details.
- If no number is stored, you will hear beeps.

4.3 Answer a Call

When there is an incoming ring, pick up the corded handset or press **SPEAKER I**) to answer the call.

4.4 Volume Boost Function

The Volume Boost function allows you to amplify the handset earpiece volume to compensate for the ear's limited sensitivity.

During a call, you can activate the Volume Boost function with the volume of earpiece increased by several dBs by pressing **SOS**/AMPLIFY, , "BOOSTER ON" displays on the base screen. To cancel it, press **SOS**/AMPLIFY, again.

4.5 End a Call

During a call, put the corded handset on the base station to end the call.

OR

Press **SPEAKER** () if you have a call in speakerphone mode.

4.6 Adjust Earpiece and Speakerphone Volume

There are 6 levels (VOLUME 1 to VOLUME 6) to choose from for each of earpiece and 7 levels for speakerphone volume of the base.

Using the base: During a call:

Press▲▼ to select volume 1-6. The current setting is shown. When you end the call, the settings will remain at the last selected level.

4.7 Mute a Call

With the call muted, you can talk to someone nearby without letting the caller hear you during a call.

Using the base: During a call:

Press $Int / \bigotimes / C$ to mute the microphone and "MUTE ON" is displayed on the LCD. Your caller cannot hear you. Press $Int / \bigotimes / C$ again to resume the microphone.

4.8 Modify the tonality during a call

Using the base: During a call:

Press M4 TONE to increase the high, low frequencies or come back in normal response.

4.9 Emergency Call without Main Power

The corded base unit can make an emergency call with the corded handset when the mains AC power is disconnected.

Pick up the corded handset and wait for several seconds to get the dial tone and then enter the phone nun to make a call.

REMARK:

It is not possible to dial numbers from memories when the mains power is off.

When the mains power is off, you can also answer an incoming call with the corded handset.

When the phone rings, pick up the corded handset to talk to the caller.

4.10 Redial the Last Number

You can redial up to 10 of the last numbers called on the cordless handset or on the corded telephone base. If you have stored a name in the phonebook to match with the number, the name will be displayed instead. The most recently dialed number will be displayed at the top of the redial list.

4.10.1 Redial a Number from the Redial List

1. In idle mode, press \P to view the redial list.

OR

Press MENU/OK 2 times to access at the redial list

- 2. Press ▲/▼ to browse the redial list.
- 3. Pick up the corded handset or press **SPEAKER** ♥ to dial to the selected redial number.

NOTE:

If there are no numbers in the redial list, the display will show "EMPTY".

4.10.2 Store a Redial Number into the Phonebook

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.10.1.
- 2. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select ADD TO PB?
- 3. Press MENU/OK and check the redial number.
- 4. Press **MENU/OK** and enter the name.

Press MENU/OK to confirm

4.10.3 Delete a Redial Number

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.10.1.
- 2. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select DELETE
- 3. Press MENU/OK to confirm and CONFIRM? is displayed.
- 4. Press MENU/OK to reconfirm

4.10.4 Delete the Entire Redial List

- 1. Follow Steps 1 and 2 in section 4.10.1
- 2. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select DELETE ALL?
- 3. Press MENU/OK to confirm and CONFIRM? Is displayed.
- 4. Press MENU/OK to reconfirm.

4.11 Find the Handset (if you have added an additional handset)

This feature helps you find the misplaced handset(s).

You can locate the handset by operation on the base station as below.

- 1. In idle mode, press **MENU/OK** and **▲/▼** to select **PAGE ALL HS**.
- 2. Press **MENU/OK** to confirm. "PAGING" will flash on the base screen.

All the handsets registered to the base will produce the paging tone, and "PAGING" will flash on the screen. You can stop the paging by pressing $\sqrt{4}$ / $\sqrt{2}$ CANCEL/MUTE on any handset or Int/ \times /C on the base to stop paging.

NOTE:

If there is an incoming call during paging, the phone will ring with the incoming call instead of paging.

4.12 Make an Internal Call (if you have added an additional handset)

This feature allows you to make internal calls, transfer external calls and make conference calls. If the called base or handset is not answered within 60 seconds, the called base or handset will stop ringing and the calling one will return to standby mode.

4.12.1 Intercom (if you have added an additional handset)

Using the corded base:

- 1. In idle mode, press *Int*/X /Cand ▲/▼ to select the handset you want to call.
- 2. Press MENU/OK to confirm.
- 3. The called handset rings. Press and on the called handset to establish the internal call.

NOTE:

If only one cordless handset is registered to the base station, press *Int/XI/C* will call the cordless handset immediately.

4.12.2 Call All Handsets (if you have added an additional handset)

Using the corded base:

- 1. In idle mode, press $Int/\bigotimes /C$ and $\blacktriangle / \bigtriangledown$ to select ALL.
- 2. Press MENU/OK to confirm.

4.12.3 Transfer an External Call (if you have added an additional handset) Using the corded base: During an external call:

- 1. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select INTERCOM
- 2. Press MENU/OK and choose the desired handset you want to intercom with, then press MENU/OK.
- 3. The external call is put on hold automatically and the called handset rings.
- 4. Press () on the called handset to establish an internal call.
- 5. Hang up the corded handset on the calling base to end the internal call.
- 6. The external call is transferred to the called handset.

4.12.4 Make a 3-way Conference Call

The conference call feature allows one external call to be shared with the corded base and cordless handset or two cordless handsets. The three parties can share the conversation and no network subscription is required.

During the external call:

- 1. Follow Steps 1 to 4 in section 4.12.3.
- 2. Press and hold \cancel{X} on the calling handset to establish the conference call.

NOTE:

Any party (corded base or cordless handset) hangs up during a conference call will leave the other party still in connection with the external call.

5. PHONEBOOK

Your phone can store up to 50 private phonebooks in the cordless handset and the telephone base with names and numbers. Each phonebook entry can have a maximum of 20 digits for the phone number and 12 characters for the name. You can also

select different ringer tones for your phonebook entries. Phonebook entries are stored alphabetically by name.

5.1 Add a New Phonebook Entry

1. Press PHONEBOOK to display the first phonebook entry in alphabetical order.

OR

- 1. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select PHONEBOOK main menu item
- 2. Press MENU/OK 2 times to access the phonebook list
- 3. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select ADD.
- 4. Press MENU/OK and enter the number.
- 5. Press MENU/OK and enter the name.
- 6. Press MENU/OK to store the phonebook entry.

5.2 Search for a Phonebook Entry

- 1. Enter the phonebook list in press the key \Box .
- 2. Enter the first character of your desired name of the phonebook entries by multi-tap.

5.3 View a Phonebook Entry

1. Press **PHONEBOOK** to display the first phonebook entry in alphabetical order.

OR

- 1. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select PHONEBOOK main menu item.
- 2. Press MENU/OK 2 times to access the phonebook list
- 3. Press ▲/▼ to select and view the desired phonebook entry.

OR

Enter the first character of your desired name of the phonebook entry by multi-tap

5.4 Edit a Phonebook Entry

1. Press PHONEBOOK to display the first phonebook entry in alphabetical order.

OR

- 1. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select PHONEBOOK main menu item.
- 2. Press MENU/OK 2 times to access the phonebook list
- 3. Scroll $\blacktriangle \nabla$ until you see the contact you want to edit.
- 4. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select EDIT.
- 5. Edit the number with the key Int/X /C and press MENU/OK.
- 6. Edit the name with the key Int/X /Cand press MENU/OK.
- 7. Press MENU/OK to confirm the setting.

5.5 Delete a Phonebook Entry

- 1. Press **MENU/OK** and **▲/▼** to select **PHONEBOOK** main menu item.
- 2. Press MENU/OK 2 times to access the phonebook list
- 3. Scroll ▲/▼ until you see the contact you want to delete.
- 4. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select DELETE.
- 5. Press MENU/OK and the display shows "CONFIRM?".
- 6. Press MENU/OK to confirm or Int/X /Cto cancel.

5.6 Delete the Entire Private Phonebook

- 1. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select PHONEBOOK main menu item.
- 2. Press MENU/OK 2 times to access the phonebook list
- 3. Press MENU/OK and ▲▼ button to select DELETE ALL.
- 4. Press MENU/OK and the display shows "CONFIRM?".
- 5. Press MENU/OK to confirm or Int/X /C to cancel.

5.7 Check the Phonebook Usage

You can check how many phonebook entries have been occupied in your phone and how many phonebook entries are available for you to store in the phonebook.

- 1. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select PHONEBOOK main menu item.
- 2. Press MENU/OK 2 times to access the phonebook list
- 3. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select STATUS.
- 4. Press MENU/OK. The display shows XX/50 USED" (XX refer to the number of phonebook entries).
- 5. Press Int/XX/C to exit

5.8 Set the Fast Dial Numbers

After setting the fast dial numbers, you can dial to the pre-set numbers by pressing lding the respective digit keys from idle mode.

5.8.1 Add or Edit the Fast Dial Number

- 1. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select PHONEBOOK main menu item.
- 2. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select SPEED DIAL
- 3. .Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select from KEY 2 to KEY 9.

If there is no number stored in the selected key:

- 4. Press **MENU/OK** and **▲/▼** to select **ADD**.
- 5. Press MENU/OK and enter the Number.
- 6. Press MENU/OK and enter the name
- 7. Press MENU/OK to save

Or if there is already a number stored in the selected key:

- 4. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select EDIT.
- 5. Press MENU/OK to edit the number
- 6. Press MENU/OK to edit the name.
- 7. Press MENU/OK to confirm.

5.8.2 View a fast dial number

You have the possibility to check the fast dial information in follow the procedure

- 1. Follow steps from 1 to 3 in section 5.8.1
- 2. Press MENU/OK to select VIEW.

If the call is an international call or with unknown number, "OUT OF AREA" will be displayed.

In standby, if three unanswered calls are received, "3 CALLS" will be displayed.

All unanswered calls are saved in calls log with the latest call putting at the top of the list. When the call list is full, the oldest call will be replaced by a new call. The unanswered call which has not been read is marked with \bigstar icon.





17 ANSWERING MACHINE

Your telephone base includes a telephone answering machine that records unanswered calls when it is on. The answering machine can store up to 59 messages within the maximum recording time of approximately 15 minutes. As well as recording incoming messages, you can record memos for other users of your phone.

17.1Switching Answering Machine On/Off

Using the base direct key:

You can switch on / switch off the TAM function by pressing ANS ON/OFF.

Using the base menu:

Alternatively, you can switch the TAM on or off using the base menu.

- 2. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to go to TAM ON/OFF.
- 3. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select ON or OFF.
- 4. Press MENU/OK to confirm.

17.2Play Messages on TAM

If you have new messages, the display will show e.g. 02/05 MSGS, which means you have 2 new message out of total 5 messages. New messages are played first, and then are saved as old messages, until they are deleted. Old messages are played again after all new messages are played completely.

Using the base direct key:

In idle:

- 1. Press PLAY/STOP to listen to messages and memos.
- 2. Press PLAY/STOP if you want to stop the playback.
- 3. Press ◀ once if you want to repeat the current message from the beginning, or press twice to skip back to the previous message during message playback.
- 4. Press ▶ if you want to skip forward to the next message during message playback.
- 5. Press **DELETE** if you want to delete the current message being played.
- 6. Press SLOW to reduce the speed of the playback

Using the base menu:

- 1. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select ANS. SYS.
- 2. Press MENU/OK to show PLAYBACK.
- 3. Press MENU/OK to start playing back the messages from speakerphone.
- During message playback, press ▼ to adjust the message playback volume respectively OR you can during the message
- Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select STOP, FORWARD, PREVIOUS, SLOW ON or DELETE to perform the following functions during message playback.
- STOP: Stop the current message playback and return to the ANS. MACHINE menu.
- FORWARD: Skip to play the next message. The date information of the next message will display if there is next message.
- SLOW ON: to reduce the speed of the playback
- **PREVIOUS:** Skip to repeat playing the current message from the beginning. The date information of the current message will display.
- DELETE: Delete the current message and the next message will be played.

Press Int/X/C to confirm the setting

NOTE:

After new message is played, the new message will be saved as an old message automatically unless it is deleted.

17.3 Delete all Messages on TAM

Using the base menu:

- 1. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select ANS. SYS.
- 2. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select DEL OLD.
- 3. Press MENU/OK. and the display shows CONFIRM?
- 4. Press MENU/OK to confirm delete all old messages.

Using the base direct key:

Press and hold DELETE to delete all the old messages.

NOTE:

You cannot delete new messages, so you will have to play them before trying to delete

17.4 Record Memos on TAM

You can record your memo message for another user. When you record a memo, the message counter will increase by one and the message can be played in the same way as answering machine messages. Memo recording can still function even when the answering machine is turned off.

- 1. Press MENU/OK and ▲▼ to select ANS SYS.
- 2. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select MEMO.
- 3. Press MENU/OK to start recording the memo, and "RECORDING" is shown on the display.
- Press MENU/OK to save and end your memo recording. The new memo will then play back automatically. Let it play to the end or press MENU/OK again to stop the playback. Or press Int/XXI / C at any time to stop the memo without saving it.

17.5 Answering Machine Settings

17.5.1 Set the talking TAM Language

You can choose the voice prompt language of the answering machine from a total of 4 languages. (English, French, Dutch and German)

- 1. Press **MENU/OK** and **▲/**▼ to select **ANS. SYS**.
- 2. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select SET TAM.
- 3. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select TAM LANG.
- 4. Press **MENU/OK** and **▲/▼** to select the desired voice prompt language for the answering machine, talking language and SOS message.
- 5. Press MENU/OK to confirm

17.5.2 Turn On or Off the Base Screening

You can select to turn on or off the call screening on base. When the answering machine is set to ON and when there is an incoming message, the base will start call screening automatically after the preset numbers of rings of answer delay.

- 1. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select ANS. SYS.
- 2. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select SET TAM.
- 3. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select CALLSCREEN.
- 4. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select ON or OFF.
- 5. Press MENU/OK to confirm.

17.5.3 Record your Outgoing Message (OGM)

You can record your own OGM for ANS & REC mode. When you record your own OGM, it will be used when the answering machine answers the call. If your personalized OGM is deleted, the pre-set OGM will be restored automatically.

- 1. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select ANS. SYS.
- 2. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select SET TAM.
- 3. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select TAM MSG.
- 4. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select RECORD.
- 5. Press **MENU/OK** to start recording your personalized OGM and "RECORDING" is displayed on the screen.
- Press MENU/OK to stop and save your personalized OGM. Your new saved OGM will playback automatically. Alternatively, press *Int*/X /C to return to previous screen without saving the personalized OGM.

17.5.4 Playback the Outgoing Message (OGM)

Using the base direct key:

Press H briefly to listen to the current OGM.

Using the base menu:

- 1. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select ANS. SYS.
- 2. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select SET TAM.
- 3. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select TAM MSG.
- 4. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select PLAY.
- 5. Press **MENU/OK** to playback your personalized OGM (if you have recorded a personalized OGM before) and "PLAYING ANNC" is displayed on the screen.
- 6. Press *Int*/XX /C to stop the OGM playback and return to the previous menu.

NOTE:

If a personalized OGM is not recorded before, the pre-set OGM will be played.

17.5.5 Delete a Personalized OGM (SET OGM to DEFAULT)

- 1. Repeat Steps 1 to 3 in the section 17.4.4
- 2. Press MENU/OK and ▲▼to select DELETE.
- 3. Press **MENU/OK** to confirm.

17.5.6 Set the Answer Delay

You can set the number of rings before the answering machine answers and starts playing your OGM. You can set the answering machine to answer after two to ten rings or TIME SAVER.

The TIME SAVER function answers calls after 6 ring signals, until the first new message has been registered - then the answering machine switches to answering after approximately 2 signals. This is useful when using remote access; if you call up the answering machine and there is no reply after four rings that means there are no messages recorded and you can hang up before you are charged for the call.

- 1. Press **MENU/OK** and \blacktriangle/Ψ to select **ANS. SYS**.
- 2. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select SET TAM.
- Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select ANS DELAY (Available options: 2 RINGS, 4 RINGS, 6 RINGS, 8 RINGS, 10 RINGS or TALL SAVE).

- 5. Press MENU/OK to confirm.

17.5.7 Set the Recording Time of Incoming Message

You can set the maximum length of the recording time of the incoming messages.

- 2. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select SET TAM.
- 3. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select REC TIME.
- Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select your desired recording time (Available options: 60S, 120S, 180S, or UNLIMITED).
- 5. Press MENU/OK to confirm.

17.5.8 Activate Remote Access

Your phone lets you check your messages, or otherwise operate your answering machine, by calling the answering machine when you are away from home by entering a 4-digit remote access PIN on a tone-dialing phone. Use the 4-digit remote access PIN code to prevent other people from unauthorized access of your answering machine.

17.5.8.1 Change the 4-Digit Remote Access PIN

- 1. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select ANS. SYS.
- 2. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select SET TAM.
- 3. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select CHANGE PIN.
- 4. Press MENU/OK and enter your new code pin
- 5. Press MENU/OK to confirm.

17.5.8.2 Activate or Deactivate the Remote access

- 1. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select ANS. SYS.
- 2. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select SET TAM.
- 3. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select REMOTE ACC.
- 4. Press MENU/OK and ▲/▼ to select ON or OFF to turn on or off the remote access respectively.
- 5. Press MENU/OK to confirm.

17.5.9 Function message alert

When you have a new message, you can hear a beep every 10 seconds. If you want deactivate this beep, follow the procedure.

- 1. Press **MENU/OK**, and $\mathbf{\nabla}/\mathbf{A}$ to select **ANS.SYS**.
- 2. Press MENU/OK, and ▼/▲ to show SET TAM.
- 3. Press MENU/OK and ▼/▲ to select MSG ALERT.
