
INTRODUCTION

M24 is a CARE PHONE with features:





GET STARTED

Installing the SIM card, memory card and battery


ATTENTION:

- Risk of swallowing small objects! The SIM card & memory card can be removed. Small children can swallow them.
- Do not bend or scratch the SIM card. Prevent any contact with water, dirt or electrical charges.
- Turn off the phone and disconnect the charger before removing the battery cover.
- Remove the battery cover:




- Insert the Nano SIM card (mandatory) and the microSD memory card (optional, not supplied):

- 1) Slide the small metal part to the left side to unlock it.
- 2) With the finger nail, lift it up softly to the left side
- 3) Place the SIM card in the SIM card holder with the golden contacts facing down and the cut corner at the upper right
- 4) Close the SIM card metal part and lock it by sliding softly to the right (drawing B)




*To expand the internal storage memory, you can insert a microSD memory card (maximum capacity of 32 GB / not included). Insert the memory card into the slot until it stops as illustrated.

- Insert the battery:



- Insert the battery into battery compartment with golden contacts of the battery facing downwards to the right of the phone. Press lightly on the top end of the battery until it snaps into place.
- Replace and secure the battery cover until it clicks into

Charge the phone



- Connect the USB plug of the adaptor to the charging socket (A) or place the device in the cradle (B or C)
- When placed on the cradle, your phone will connect with the base via Bluetooth (Base LED steady blue). You can use the phone menus and make, answer, continue or terminate calls in handsfree mode or listen to the radio on the base loudspeaker.
- (**A valid Bluetooth pairing between M24 and the base is required; your system has been paired at the factory. In case of need, see "PAIRING M24 WITH THE BASE")

ATTENTION:

- Only use battery, charger and accessories that have been approved for using with this particular model. Connecting other accessories may be dangerous and may invalidate the
- When charging the battery for the first time, it should be charged for at least 4 hours.
- When using the base, make sure phone orientation is matching figures B or C

SOS Assistance button

- Long press (for 3 seconds to dial out assistance number
- Follow the voice message, the recipient of the assistance call can press ${f 0}$ to accept the call. ${f M24}$ will enter the handsfree mode automatically
- If the call was not accepted, M24 will keep dialing out until the call is accepted
- To terminate, press and hold (🕪)

SOS mode Setting:

- Press Menu > \triangle/∇ > SOS Settings > 1. SOS Mode Setting 1. SOS numbers (SOS button to call 5 Emergency
- 2. Service center (SOS button to call Service center number if available)
- 3. OFF (SOS button is deactivated)
- Press **OK** to select

SOS number Setting:

- Press Menu > \triangle/∇ > SOS Settings > 2. SOS Number
- Select the numbers (5 Max). Options or Edit can be
 - 1. Add From Phonebook

Service Center number setting:

- Press Menu > \triangle/∇ > SOS Settings > 3. Service Center
- Enter the number and press **Done**

- Press Menu > \triangle / ∇ > SOS Settings > 4. Voice message
- 1. **Default > Select** Default voice message announced to the recipient of the assistance call
- 2. Custom > Select User recorded voice message announced to the recipient of the assistance call

ATTENTION:

- Remember to set the SOS numbers and inform all the recipients.
- To have SOS function working normally, the network service must be active.

Talking Dialing Digits

While pressing the numeric buttons, M24 will announce the corresponding number.

(Press Menu > Settings > Profiles > General > Customize > Keypad..... User can select Talking dialing digits, Silence or Key tone.)

Talking Caller ID Name

User can record a name/message associated to the PHOTO phonebook contacts. When the incoming caller number matches the phone number in the photo phonebook, the corresponding recorded name/message will be announced instead of the normal ring melody.

(Press → > △/▽ > View > Edit > Caller ringtone >..... User can delete the recorded message to restore the normal ringtone)

PHOTO Phonebook

- Press → > △/▼ to select the 10 photo memories
- Press (\ \) to dial out

ADD PHOTO Phonebook contact

- Press $> \triangle \sqrt{>} > Add....$ (Or, View > Edit..... for current
 - 1. Picture > O > Save (To take a new photo)
 - 2. Contact > input the name and number > Save
 - 3. Caller ringtone > Record > record the name/voice message > Stop > Play (to check)
- When these 10 contacts is calling in, the associated voice message will be announced. If no voice message is recorded, the phone will ring with normal ringtone.

TORCH

- Make a long press **□** to turn ON/OFF

SMART TOOLS S

- Intelligent Ringer
 In order not to miss a call, the ringer loudness will automatically set to maximum when the same phone number calls the second time within 3 minutes after the initial missed
- After the call is answered, the ringer loudness will be resumed to the user selected volume level.

(Press Menu > So > i.Ringer..... User can switch this feature ON/OFF)

Smart Notification

- SMS will be sent to the **Helper** (Mobile phone number) for MISSED CALL or BATTERY LOW of your phone.
- Helper mobile phone number can be set under the same Smart Tools menu.

(Press Menu > > s.Notices.....)

Smart Care

- SMS will be sent to the Helper (Mobile phone number) for LACK of PHONE CALL ACTIVITIES or LACK of PHYSICAL **ACTIVITIES** (key detect, open/close of the phone, charging
- Helper mobile phone number can be set under the same Smart Tools menu.

(Press Menu > Smart Care.....)

PAIRING M24 WITH THE BASE

- Go to Menu > Network > Bluetooth
- If Bluetooth is OFF, press **ON** softkey to activate
- Go down to **Pairing** and press **OK** > **OK** to start searching
- Press and hold the base pairing button (5 in Fig. B) Once M24 completes the scanning process, select M24 Smart Base from the device list and press Pair softkey. Release Pairing button.
- Place M24 on the base. Status LED should turn steady

PROBLEMS AND SOLUTIONS

Screen frozen or no response when pressing keys	Remove the battery for 3 minutes and try again

TIPS ON THE BATTERY
